We write today in support of the appeal for the Port of Tillamook Bay's Alternate Project #13 to Project Worksheet (PW) 936V1. The appeal has been diligently reviewed and revised by the Port of Tillamook Bay, Oregon Emergency Management (OEM), and an outside consultant. All entities have concluded that the above mentioned project is cost effective and meets FEMA guidelines.

The singular issue remaining on appeal is whether or not the alternative project is cost effective. It is our understanding that the Benefit-Cost Analysis (BCA) for the project was conducted in full accordance with FEMA policies and guidance and meets the requirements of the Public and Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant programs. FEMA published guidance for the Benefit-Cost Analysis Reengineering and Hazards US models were reportedly adhered to by the applicant, and validated by OEM. In conducting the BCA, the Port of Tillamook Bay utilized default values provided by FEMA, and on more than one occasion chose to utilize more conservative, locally derived values. The benefit-cost analysis as presented by the applicant appears to be defensible using analysis procedures prescribed by FEMA.

In addition, we request that this case receive an expedited appeal. State bonds have been issued as matching funds for this project and may become subject to arbitration if this appeal is not resolved in a timely manner.
